It was important, therefore, that our students still had the opportunity to reflect and pay their respects to the fallen.

As well as this, throughout the week, our Bede family took time to remember and honour anyone who students may have lost in recent times, as we all face the consequences of COVID 19. Further still, we remembered the tragic loss, last October, of Ellen Raffell, a treasured student of the Academy, dear friend to many, precious daughter to Mr & Mrs Raffell and beloved sister to Abbey. We are in the process of designing an enduring way to mark the gift of Ellen's life to us all, but in the meantime, students have thought about the Word of God in Isaiah ch.41 v.10:

'Do not be afraid, for I am with you;'

and the comfort and hope this offers as a reminder that those who loved us and whom we loved, never truly leave our lives – a promise God makes too.



Northumberland Library has a digital library that can be accessed all the time. It contains eBooks and eAudiobooks for both adults, young adults, and children. In the current climate it has proved to be popular with our library members and we would like to try and make more people aware of this free service. If people are not

members, they can join online at the [library website](#) and get access straight away without having to come into the library to collect their card.

- Download up to 5 eBooks and 5 eAudio titles at a time.
- Titles are automatically returned at the end of the loan period, so there are no fines for late returns.
- Select 'BorrowBox Library' from the Apple App store or Google Play or via Games + Apps on Amazon Kindle Fire to download the BorrowBox app to your device.
